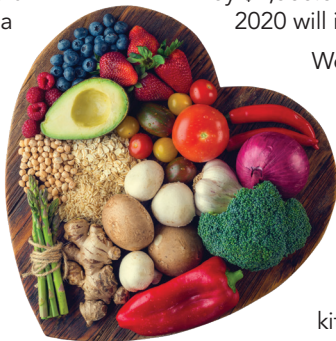

COACH'S NOTES

Summer is long gone and colder temperatures are on the way. Last year our food suppliers switched partially from Meals on Wheels to direct pickups under Feeding Tampa Bay. We are happy to report that we still have a great working relationship with Meals on Wheels. Under the new plan we are receiving a lot more meat and produce. In the first three quarters of 2019 we picked up 255,546 pounds of food items, (113 tons) and 108,000 pounds from Meals on Wheels. In nine months, our soup kitchen at Our Daily Bread and Loaves and Fishes we distributed over 160 tons of food to the needy in our community.

As of October 1st, our USDA food items are coming through Feeding Tampa Bay! We are praying the change will work out as well as



last year. Both of the changes have provided more food but our costs (payroll, fuel, supplies and maintenance) have increased by \$2,500.00 per month. Our budget for 2020 will increase by \$30,000.00.

We have been truly blessed with all the food coming in and we pass on the blessings to the needy, families and the homeless in our community. The needs are greater every year. The numbers of people we are feeding in the soup kitchen are up 5% from last year. The meals have improved because of the meat products we have available. At Loaves and Fishes we are serving, Monday and Friday, we are seeing increased numbers of families who receive 15 food items, fresh produce and frozen meats.

This summer we have new volunteers working on updating our Facebook page

and our Website. At this point it's a work in progress. Hopefully by years' end we will have a new look that will be more like our newsletter for you to browse and find helpful.

Penny, our kitchen manager, has been busy with some employee turnover, van repairs and running out of supplies due to the greater demand for services all while I was up north enjoying my summer holiday. God bless Penny and the team for holding down the fort!!

TURNING POINTS NOTES

As we enter the autumn season and end of the year activities begin to crowd the calendar, I would like to pause and reflect on all the great progress we have made as an organization this year. As our programs have grown



in response to the growing needs of our clients, we have expanded our staffing, recruiting people who are compassionate, qualified and dedicated to our mission of "providing, coordinating and facilitating services to prevent and end homelessness in our community." We are grateful for the services of these wonderful staff members, but also for the incredible group of volunteers who faithfully serve in each department of the organization daily. Being able to perceive the direct impact their service has for our clients is a benefit that keeps them coming back to volunteer. The strength of our organization has recently been recognized in two very substantial and important ways.

First, Turning Points has achieved a four star rating from Charity Navigator, the highest rating possible. Charity Navigator is a major charity assessment organization that evaluates charitable organizations in the United States, so achieving this rating is a major accomplishment that identifies our work as a responsible, effective and transparent organization.

Second, Turning Points was selected as the Manatee Chamber of Commerce Non-Profit of the Year, from a list of nine stellar organizations that were finalists for this recognition.

This award considered not only the financial and operational functions of the organization, but the contributions made by our board of directors, our staff and volunteers. We are proud of these accomplishments and the credibility they provide for the important work we are performing. We invite you to come on by and see for yourself what a difference Turning Points makes in the lives of people who are struggling with issues related to homelessness. As the current administration reduces funding for food stamps, housing and main stream benefits we will continue to see growth in numbers of people requesting assistance - whether to keep them from becoming homeless (prevention) or to help them back into housing if they have already become homeless (rapid re-housing). Please remember these people during the upcoming holiday season and help us as we strive to prevent and end homelessness for our neighbors in need.
